**EXPLANATION OF LEGEND ITEMS**

Roads Open to Highway Legal Vehicles Only  
 These roads are open only to motor vehicles licensed under state law for operation on all public roads within the state.

Roads Open to All Vehicles  
 These roads are open to all motor vehicles, including smaller off-highway vehicles such as ATVs, snowmobiles, and mopeds. Use of off-highway vehicles is prohibited on these roads.

Trail Open to All Vehicles  
 These trails are open to all motor vehicles, including both off-highway and on-highway motor vehicles.

Seasonal Designation  
 The symbol, used in conjunction with one of the other road or trail symbols, indicates that the road or trail is open only during certain periods of the year. Refer to Seasonal and Special Designation Tables for further information.

Designated Camping  
 This symbol is used along with a designated road or trail to indicate where dispersed motor vehicle use is permitted. A specific distance from the road, usually for the purpose of dispersed camping, is indicated. The symbol also shows the location of dispersed camping sites. Refer to the Dispersed Camping Table for specific information.

Open State (OC) Information  
 These symbols are used to show where the Forest Service does not have jurisdiction and use is not restricted for dispersed camping. These symbols indicate where boundary connections to lands and areas outside the forest boundary.

State Route Identifier  
 This symbol is used for roads that are too short to show a symbol on the map. The symbol contains the number of the road or trail. Users should refer to the corresponding number in the State Route Table for designation corresponding to the road or trail.

Areas Open to Cross-County Travel  
 These areas are on National Forest System land that allow cross-county travel by motor vehicles. Specific vehicle classes and seasonal designations may be indicated in the Seasonal and Special Designation Table.

**PURPOSE AND CONTENTS OF THIS MAP**

The designations shown on this motor vehicle use map (MVM) were made by the responsible official pursuant to 36 CFR 212.51, are effective as of the date on the front cover of this MVM, and will remain in effect until superseded by next year's MVM.

**PROHIBITIONS**

It is prohibited to operate a motor vehicle on National Forest System lands on the Siuslaw National Forest, Oregon, unless specifically authorized by the responsible official. This prohibition applies regardless of the presence or absence of a sign.

Operation of a motor vehicle on National Forest System lands is prohibited unless specifically authorized by the responsible official. This prohibition applies regardless of the presence or absence of a sign.

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**OPERATOR RESPONSIBILITIES**

Operating a motor vehicle on National Forest System lands carries a greater responsibility than operating that vehicle in a city or developed setting. Not only must you know and follow applicable traffic laws, you must also be prepared to respond to an emergency. The operator is responsible for the maintenance and use of all other forest roads. Operator responsibilities include: observing, registering, and reporting; observing, registering, and reporting; observing, registering, and reporting.

**DISCRIMINATION**

**Distinctive and Horizontal Route Markers**

Horizontal route markers typically consist of four digits with the first two digits identifying the route number. The route number is placed on the left side of the marker. The first two digits are placed on the right side of the marker.

Vertical route markers identify roads that are not maintained by the Forest Service. These markers typically identify the higher level road number. The higher level road number is placed horizontally above the route number.
